Chapter 10: The Divine Omniscience

Could God at any time or in any manner receive into His mind knowledge that He did not possess and had not possessed from eternity, He would be imperfect and less than himself. To think of a God who must sit at the feet of a teacher...is to think of someone other than the Most High God. (page 55)

What was your reaction to the idea that God cannot learn?

One of the core aspects to the human condition is the capacity to learn. What are some of the most invaluable lessons God has taught you?

Because God knows all things perfectly, He knows no thing better than any other thing, but all things equally well. He never discovers anything. He is never surprised, never amazed. He never wonders about anything nor (except when drawing men out for their own good) does He seek information or ask questions. (pages 56)

Read Luke 7:4-10. How do you align what Tozer says with this passage?

How have you found God to guide you in times when you were swimming in questions knowing God knows all and is your greatest ally?

And to us who have fled for refuge to lay hold upon the hope that is set before us in the gospel, how unutterably sweet is the knowledge that our Heavenly Father knows us completely. No talebearer can inform on us, no enemy can make an accusation stick; no forgotten skeleton can come tumbling out of some hidden closet to abash us and expose our past; no unsuspected weakness in our character can come to light to turn God away from us, since He knew us utterly before we knew Him and called us to Himself in the full knowledge of everything that was against us.
